The Liberty ISD Education Foundation was pleased to announce this year's grant winners on Apr. 20, 2022. Six grants were awarded in this cycle to teachers. These grants are funded through contributions to the Liberty ISD Education Foundation by individual donors, businesses, corporations and community service organizations as well as through profits from our fundraising events. This year's six grants total \$32,991. Since 2007, the total grant funding to LISD is \$288,259!

The various projects funded in this year's cycle are listed below by campus:

INNOVATIVE TEACHING GRANTS

Liberty High School A/V Communications System – Richard Ewing \$8,151 This grant creates an upgraded communications system to be demonstrate the Farm to Table concept. This grant is funded in part by *The JoBeth Willoughby Teaching Grant, The Jana Marie Buchanan Grant, The Norman and Brenda Dykes Endowment and The Liberty County Farm Bureau Endowment.*

Liberty Middle School Beyond the Classroom Adventures – Elisha Lemelle \$17,397

This grant funds a classroom Virtual Reality lab allowing an entire class to simultaneously experience virtual, augmented or mixed reality content. This grant is funded in part by *The Baxter W. Social Learning through Lego Play– Tabitha Pritchett/Elisha Lemelle \$500 This project uses a lego wall to help students de-escalate from heightened emotions during the school day. This grant is funded by The Ken Berry Grant, *The Debbie Beasley Grant and the Liberty Lions Club Grant.*

San Jacinto Elementary SchoolDocument This – Ana Samano/Stacey Neal\$758This grant supplies a documentcamera for classroom use.

Financial Position

Our financial position continues to be strong even though the market was not as strong as last year. The Ester Melaski Scholarship was donated by their family members to become part of our grant initiative.

The Liberty Freedom Ride nor the Gala were as profitable as hoped, causing the directors to re-evaluate those events. In our strategic planning, sponsorship of events was stressed as the way to maximize the profit for these fundraising efforts.

Payroll deduction was extremely successful more than doubling our current participation from LISD staff. Rhonda Smith and Mychal English will be teaching us their successful strategy this year.

Change of Fundraising Events

Directors were forward thinking in their approach to events and fundraising though after responding to suggestions from the group to make our fundraising events more profitable.

Casino Night, scheduled for March 4th at the TVE in Liberty started off with a \$40,000 sponsorship drive. "That takes so much pressure off of the ticket sales and effort to be an event that can help our Innovative Grant Initiative," Wright said. "I'm very appreciative of our directors and their efforts."
